O come, thou Dayspring from on high, and cheer us by thy drawing nigh; disperse the gloomy clouds of night, and death's dark shadows put to flight.





GOD'S WORD GIVEN TO US

* Scripture reading Luke 1:26–45

^{1:26} In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent from God to a city of Galilee named Nazareth, ²⁷ to a virgin betrothed to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. And the virgin's name was Mary. ²⁸ And he came to her and said, "Greetings, O favored one, the Lord is with you!" ²⁹ But she was greatly troubled at the saying, and tried to discern what sort of greeting this might be. ³⁰ And the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. ³¹ And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus. ³² He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. And the Lord God will give to him the throne of his father David, ³³ and he will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end."

³⁴ And Mary said to the angel, "How will this be, since I am a virgin?"

³⁵ And the angel answered her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be called holy—the Son of God. ³⁶ And behold, your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son, and this is the sixth month with her who was called barren. ³⁷ For nothing will be impossible with God." ³⁸ And Mary said, "Behold, I am the servant of the Lord; let it be to me according to your word." And the angel departed from her.

³⁹ In those days Mary arose and went with haste into the hill country, to a town in Judah, ⁴⁰ and she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. ⁴¹ And when Elizabeth heard the greeting of Mary, the baby leaped in her womb. And Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit, ⁴² and she exclaimed with a loud cry, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb! ⁴³ And why is this granted to me that the mother of my Lord should come to me? ⁴⁴ For behold, when the sound of your greeting came to my ears, the baby in my womb leaped for joy. ⁴⁵ And blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfillment of what was spoken to her from the Lord."



Advent Offerings

Each year, during the Advent season, we collect extra offerings for particular ministries. As we meditate on Christ's coming, we encourage you to prayerfully consider joining us as a body in this opportunity to express our gratitude and worship. During each week of Advent a different ministry will be presented. The offerings collected throughout the season are divided evenly among the ministries. Designated envelopes are available at the welcome center or through the online giving form by selecting Advent Offerings. This year the ministries include the following:

Afghan Refugees

Besides its long-standing adoption and foster care service, Bethany has been involved in providing housing and resettlement for refugees from many countries. Now, because of the crisis in Afghanistan, they anticipate more than 230 Afghan refugees arriving by the end of this year, mostly younger families. There is a great need for funds, donated items, and volunteers who can help with the many practical needs of resettlement. We also challenge you to pray about forming a team to be a co-sponsor with Bethany staff to help these newcomers get through the hurdles of medical and legal registration, transportation, language learning, finding housing, and just friendship.

Central American Teen Moms

Michelle Suwyn has been working with Teen Moms through Young Life in Latin America for many years. Many teen moms feel like they do not belong anywhere. Getting these Moms and kids away with leaders and friends to process the gospel being spoken over them is a place God moves powerfully. This experience can give teen moms new hope knowing they are seen, welcomed, loved and invited not just to camp but into a relationship with Jesus. Young Lives has a goal of sending 160 girls to various camps in the next couple of months.

New City Catechism in Japanese

Because of the dearth of quality discipleship books and Christian training materials in Japanese, Christ Bible Institute has set a goal of providing Gospel Resources for every Christian in Japan. One of their projects is the reprinting of the New City Catechism Devotional which they first translated and published in 2019. They have already distributed 5,000 copies for free and now are in need of a second printing. Our own pastoral resident, Masakuni Hotta, is deeply involved in this ministry and had the honor to be part of the translation and editing team for this excellent resource.

Mel Trotter Ministries

has teamed up with **Next Step** to more effectively provide job skill training and job placement for the most vulnerable and unemployed people on the streets of Grand Rapids. Some have spent time in prison, dealt with addictions, but they desire to build a better life. Many of the leaders in Next Step are former missionaries, working shoulder to shoulder with their clients to rediscover their identity as beloved people made in God's image. Once accepted in the program, they show up every day for work, learn the discipline of work, and develop wood working job skills. They get paid for what they do, making items for retail sales, and eventually most move to a longer-term job placement. There will be a deacon fund collection next Sunday. Consider giving beyond your regular tithe to serve those in need.
